

Agriculture/Natural Resources Scholarships – Northern Neck

Grow Ag Leaders – Scholarships (each \$1500) available nationally to high school seniors and college students pursuing education in ag-related fields. Sponsored by the Bayer Fund. Colonial Agricultural Education Foundation – Multiple scholarships (\$1500 - \$5000) available to students furthering their education at a college or university (must be a full-time student). Must live within the counties served by Colonial Farm Credit (all Northern Neck counties qualify). Northern Neck Soil and Water Conservation District (NNSWCD) – Three scholarships are available (\$1000 each). The Virginia Association of Soil and Water Conservation Districts (VASWCD) awards one scholarship to a VA high school senior interested in natural resources and the environment. The second scholarship, *The J.C. Berger Conservation Advancement Scholarship* is open to students with permanent residency within Northumberland, Richmond, Lancaster, or Westmoreland counties, who will begin a full time, first year college curriculum in natural resource and/or environmental studies. The third scholarship, *The James Edward Minor Ag Stewardship Award* is open to full-time undergraduate college students, with permanent residency within Northumberland, Richmond, Lancaster, or Westmoreland counties who are enrolled in a college level curriculum in natural resources and/or environmental studies. Preference is given to applicants pursuing a course of study in an agriculture-related field. Applications are due April 1.
